A representative from NEXUS (provider of primary and community health services) will also be available to answer your questions and provide information about their services.




Everyone is welcome to come to this information session. You do not have to be a U3A member.

This film marked Ingrid Bergman's Hollywood comeback, after being effectively blacklisted in 1949 for having an affair with director Roberto Rossellini and having a child out of wedlock. This movie was based on the story of Anna Anderson, a woman who claimed to be the Grand Duchess Anastasia. It was later discovered that, in fact, she was not who she claimed to be; the mystery was solved through DNA examination of a small piece of tissue cut from Anna in an operation years before. A group of exiled Russians claim to have found the living daughter of the Tsar, presumed executed in 1918. Ingrid Bergman won the Oscar for Best Actress and the film was nominated for Best Music Oscar.

The Royal Australian Navy Band has generously offered to perform two fundraising concerts to assist with repair and recovery of the Wetlands. Starting at 1pm, the first concert is titled "Chamberwaves". It will feature smaller ensembles including the clarinet choir, brass quintet and woodwind quintet.
